The Adirondack Mennonite Heritage Association purchased the pioneer John Moser homestead (Mennonite Heritage Farm) on the Erie Canal Road, Croghan, in 1990 as an open-air history museum. The Moser homestead is the oldest and most original dwelling; its purpose is preserving the religious heritage of the Mennonite community.
